#### INITIATIVES

The employment unit engaged in the following broad outreach initiatives in accordance with various elements of FCC Rule 73.2080(c)(2):

Participated in **job banks**, **internet programs**, and other programs designed to promote outreach generally (i.e., that are not primarily directed to providing notification of specific job vacancies). KRCL staff and volunteers regularly participate in outreach activities in the community including:

- KRCL's Radioactive program organizes and hosts a public affairs lecture/debate series "Ballots Talk" in collaboration with the Salt Lake City Library's Marmalade branch. Each event in the series focuses on a different ballot initiative that Utahns will vote on in November 2018. Events held 3/15/18, 4/3/18, 5/14/18.
- KRCL's Radioactive program organizes and hosts "Local Conversations" a conversation series where community members discuss immigration and the experiences of new Americans. First event was held 4/25/18 at the Marmalade branch of the Salt Lake City Public Library.
- KRCL organized "Amplifying Women's Voices" rally at the Utah State Capitol, on International Women's Day, 3/8/18. With speakers from local organizations, student groups, and a musical performance by

 KRCL staff and volunteers regularly participate in outreach at community, educational, musical, arts, and governmental events. The KRCL booths at these events promotes KRCL programming, resources, community events, and job opportunities. Examples include Salt Lake City and Ogden Twilight events, SLC Clean Air Fair, and the Utah Arts Festival.

KRCL management supports staff participation in conferences and trainings where they gain knowledge, skills and a greater understanding of the broadcasting industry

- Development Director attended Utah Non-Profit Association's annual conference, 9/14/18, Layton, UT
- KRCL's Radioactive program hosts monthly "Open Mic" sessions at the Salt Lake City Main Library's Creative Lab, where members of the public are given the opportunity to record a story in the same manner and with the same equipment as KRCL hosts. Instruction is given on audio recording and editing. Staff answers questions about broadcasting careers and public media employment opportunities.

Participated in events or programs sponsored by educational institutions relating to career opportunities in broadcasting.

Provided assistance to unaffiliated non-profit entities in maintaining web sites that provide counseling on the process of searching for broadcast employment and/or other career development assistance pertinent to broadcasting

- KRCL partners with Spyhop to offer the "Loud and Clear Program Youth Radio" program. Teens learn how to produce radio shows, DJ, and host live bands. Participants host a weekly, hour-long radio program.
- GM gave a presentation to University of Utah non-profit administration students on the management of a public media organization. 4/19/18.
- GM hosted student staff of KBLU 92.3, the student radio station of Utah State University.5/25/18.
- GM served as an advisor to KUTE, an internet radio station on the University of Utah campus. Service began 9/1/15.

Participated in **other** activities designed by the station employment unit reasonably calculated to further the goal of disseminating information as to employment opportunities in broadcasting to job candidates who might otherwise be unaware of such opportunities.

- All full-time positions are posted to the Utah Workforce Services job bank, which makes job postings available to Workforce Service agencies throughout the state.
- KRCL sends out a weekly email to approximately 12,000 subscribers informing them of station programming and events, community events, and job opportunities.
- Information about employment opportunities are posted to KRCL's social media including Facebook and Twitter.
